- Climate policy de-emphasized at the federal level
 - Clean Power Plan suspended, to be replaced
 - NEPA GHG guidance scrapped
 - Social cost of carbon guidance revoked
- New theme of "energy dominance" has emerged
 - How will the Administration foster CCUS as a critical tool, domestically and internationally?
- Administration pushing for tighter federal budgets
 - CCUS funding oriented toward early-stage development, not commercialization
- Infrastructure development



- Deregulatory impetus key possibilities:
 - Streamlining infrastructure permitting
 - Improvements to Class VI UIC regulations
 - Will the GHG Reporting Rule continue?
 - Need for <u>some</u> means to show secure storage will persist because of investor, activist interest
- Increasing significance of private actions
 - Shareholder actions
 - Divestment movement
- Tax reform
 - Enhancement of Section 45Q tax credit
 - Definition of "secure geological storage"
 - Private activity bonds and master limited partnerships
- Interest in CCUS advocacy increasing



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
